

#### a letter from our founder...

Dear Friends,

We are excited to provide you with our first Annual Report and share an overview of what has been taking place in the last ten years.

It all began back in 2003 when I heard the story of Nhu, a young Vietnamese girl living as a refugee in Cambodia. Nhu had been sold to a man by her grandmother. During this worst experience of her life she cried out to God, praying that He would help her to prevent this from happening to any other children. When I heard Nhu's story I knew I could not continue living my life in the same way. I knew God was calling me to do everything within my power to stop this kind of thing from happening. So I committed, until the day I died, that my life would be about preventing children from being sold into the sex trade.

As I began to do research and travel the world, I discovered that 1.2 million children were being sold each year. I thoroughly evaluated dozens of organizations that were addressing this issue, predominantly through intervention—rescuing children from brothels. After spending a couple of years partnering with and giving to those types of organizations, two things became clear to me: innocence lost is never fully restored, and the sex traffickers will always find more children unless the supply is cut off at its source.

These years of research culminated in the founding of Remember Nhu ~ a non-profit organization committed to ending child sex slavery through prevention. We identify children who are at risk of being sold and provide them with a home in which their physical, educational, emotional and spiritual needs are met. We are committed to helping children all over the world, regardless of their country or background—because we believe that every child deserves to grow up happy, healthy and free from sexual exploitation.

We started implementing this vision by raising funds to open homes and identifying individuals who would sponsor children. Our first children's home opened in Cambodia in 2007 with 15 girls. Today we have \$2 million in annual revenues with more than 1100 children living in 50 homes spanning 11 different countries! More importantly, as a result, villages once ravaged by the sex trade are no longer selling their children.

Many people try to praise me for what has happened through Remember Nhu. But, I would like to clearly state that I give all of the praise, power, honor, and glory to Jesus Christ. Any good that has been done through Remember Nhu is because it was in God's heart to protect these children.

One of the most beautiful parts of Remember Nhu's story is the thousands of people who have partnered with us to make all of this possible. I want to express my most heartfelt appreciation for each of you. You have been the real heroes to the children of Remember Nhu in giving of your time, abilities, finances and in countless other ways. With your help, we can open more homes in other countries and thus save many more children. I believe in our lifetime we can see the realization of our mission statement: ending child



#### helping a desperate young mother

young mother sat begging in the local market while holding her 2 year old daughter. Ridden with AIDS, the young mother was desperate to ease her pain with drugs. She was also concerned about her daughter. Who would look after her? Her husband also had the dreaded disease. They were alone, just the three of them. Eyes without hope and body malnourished, anyone looking at this toddler would instantly feel their heartstrings tug to give them money or food. And, just the opposite, any predator would have an opportunity for "easy prey".

"Will you buy my daughter?" the young mother asked our House Mother. Instead, our House Mother gave her some money for food as she said "we cannot buy your daughter." She knew that if the young mother asked the wrong person, this toddler would live a short life of hell. She also knew that it was illegal to buy a child, even if intentions were honest and for the child's own good. As she turned to leave, the toddler's young hands grabbed our House Mother's arm and would not let go. As our House Mother pried open the toddler's strong grip, she and the young mother exchanged phone numbers. She would see what she could do. The toddler cried and our House Mother left, begging God to keep the child


safe until she could return with authorities.

It took a month of phone conversations and face-to-face meetings before the young mother agreed to give up her child.

The next day our House Mother and a social worker conducted an interview in the young parents' squatter shack. Legal documents were signed and made legitimate with the customary thumbprints. A few moments later, the young parents gave their young daughter a final hug. Then our House Mother, relieved, and thankful, returned to the Children's Home with the youngest child we had ever taken in. A few months later, after the toddler was safe in her Remember Nhu home, her mother passed away from AIDS, and a year later, her father.

Today, the happy and active five-year-old is free from HIV/AIDS and safe in Remember Nhu's care. Full of boundless energy and eyes that sparkle and have hope, she keeps everyone on their toes.


#### boys receive a mother's love...

hile many people think about girls in the sex trade, boys now represent 25-30% of the market. We opened our first all-boys home in Thailand with eight rambunctious youngsters aged 6-14. We desperately sought House Parents, but the best-qualified applicant was a single woman. Founder Carl Ralston and the Remember Nhu international workers were a little hesitant. How would the boys respond to a female authority figure in a male-dominated society? Would they

listen? We were pleasantly surprised by their obedience and respectfulness to her leadership, and it didn't take long to figure out why. Through her quietness she leads her boys by example. She does a wonderful job protecting these young boys who were at risk; and they know that, perhaps for the first time in their lives, they are receiving a mother's love.




