What happens after a home sponsorship is established?

After your church starts sponsoring a home, communication begins between the church and the home. Sponsor families receive biographical information about their child, as well as updates about that particular child and the progress of the entire home. Sponsoring families also have the opportunity to provide Christmas gifts for their child (a gift that can fit into a one-gallon plastic bag, along with a photograph of the family, and notes or cards; value should range from \$5-50.) Often, the church or some of the families decide they would like to visit the home.

How big does our church have to be to sponsor a home?

The answer to this question depends on the commitment of the congregation: we have had homes sponsored from congregations that were smaller than 150 people. If your church wants to sponsor a home but does not have 7-15 sponsor families, Remember Nhu can match you with another church and the two churches can sponsor a home together.

What are the benefits for our church?

There are numerous benefits of a church-sponsored children's home with Remember Nhu. As sponsor families start talking about the children's home, community grows and flourishes. God opens eyes and hearts to other missional works because they have been exposed to a developing country and needs in the world. If they choose, sponsor families can develop adult bible studies or home groups with a focus being the children's home, which interconnects those people within the church. Remember Nhu also has seen people get focused on the children and needs within a developing country. James 1:27 describes perfect religion as caring for orphans and widows, so this partnership allows for an opportunity to live out that command.

Here are the primary ways that your church can partner with Remember Nhu to prevent children from being sold...

Launch a Nonprofit With Us

We have a vision to "duplicate" the success of Remember Nhu's prevention model by equipping and releasing other leaders to start new nonprofits. These organizations will receive guidance and training from our staff, and will learn the "how to" of establishing successful homes for children. Our expectation is that over 700 children will be saved from experiencing the horrors of the sex slave industry in the first 10 years of operation for each one of these new nonprofits.

We are identifying communities and leaders who have a passion to make a difference in ending child sex slavery. Our goal is to equip them with our prevention nonprofit handbook, training on how to start, and partner with churches to provide funding of initial startup costs. Sponsor Foster Care in a Country

In numerous countries, we are now keeping at-risk children out of the sex trade by pairing them with loving foster parents. If your church has a heart for foster care, a great way to partner is through committing to sponsor Remember Nhu foster pairings in a given country. This would mean helping us to identify 10 sponsor families in your church to sponsor foster care, with the potential of your church also taking short-term mission trips to do projects for foster families in this country. We do not ask for any money given by your church other than helping us to identify the sponsor families in your congregation.

Sponsor a Home for Children

One of our greatest needs is to pair churches with children's homes. These are 24-7 homes run by indigenous house parents and helpers where children are kept happy, safe and free from sex slavery.

The rest of this brochure is a Q&A about what it looks like for a church to sponsor a Remember Nhu home...

What does a church-sponsored home look like?

The church is asked to allow a representative of Remember Nhu to speak at the church in order to explain the Remember Nhu Child Sponsorship Program. If there is interest in the congregation and we can obtain sponsorship for between 7-12 children, Remember Nhu will dedicate that entire home to your church as the church sponsor



What does it cost the church?

Remember Nhu asks the church to request potential sponsor families within their congregation. Each of the sponsor families is asked to give \$60 per month, which will provide for their sponsor child's physical, educational, emotional and spiritual needs to be met. Remember Nhu does not ask the church to give anything other than the opportunity to find sponsor families within the church.





How do we start?

Step 1: Remember Nhu asks the Pastor, Elder Board, or Missions Director to approve Remember Nhu speaking to the congregation.

Step 2: A meeting is held with Remember Nhu and church representatives to answer any questions.

Step 3: Remember Nhu speaks to the congregation and offers the opportunity to sponsor a child.

Step 4: Remember Nhu determines if there is enough interest to establish a home sponsorship for your church. If so, Remember Nhu receives commitments from sponsor families and the church begins to receive communication updates on the home. However if it is a new home startup, then begins the process of finding indigenous house parents and a location for the home. Once those are established, Remember Nhu begins interviewing children to live in the home. Sometimes, people will start giving funds to Remember Nhu before the home opens; these funds go toward the setup of the home, which costs between \$10,000-\$20,000 on average. These costs cover the renting of a facility, bunk beds, appliances, utensils, and everything that is needed to start a home. Remember Nhu does not ask the church to pay for the home start-up costs. The children's home will usually open with 7-15 children.
