A Letter from our Founder...

Dear Friends.

Last year's growth is a testament to God's provision for the children of Remember Nhu and the generosity of amazing supporters like *you* who rise up during challenging times to sacrificially give for the world's most vulnerable!

As a result of God's provision, we saw the opening of a new children's home in Gambia, West Africa, and another new home in Tanzania, East Africa—each home serving 14 girls. We also expanded to care for new at-risk children through Foster Care in multiple European countries.

In addition to the new prevention homes, we were also able to add over 45 new children to our care in places like Myanmar, Cambodia, Kenya, Romania and Moldova! We finished the fiscal year serving **1,589 children** in prevention homes.

It is worth noting that many regions of the world where we have programs have faced adversity due to political tensions in the past year. In February 2021 there was a military coup in Myanmar which has presented many challenges. There was also a failed coup attempt in Gambia, and a massive political union strike in Bolivia that shut down transportation for a period of time. At the time I write this, the conflict in Europe is impacting Ukraine and other countries we work in.

Through it all, we praise God for keeping our children and staff safe, and our prevention efforts continue to move forward in these countries! Would you join us in praying for God's continued protection over Remember Nhu children and staff in these parts of the world?

It is amazing to see how God continues to sustain the work of *Ending Child Sex Slavery Through Prevention*. One of Remember Nhu's longest sitting board members has a saying that I agree with: "*God loves Remember Nhu*." The Remember Nhu team and I truly do sense God's Agape, perfect love for the at-risk children we serve.

We have big dreams for this next year to continue bringing God's Agape and safety to more at-risk children. From the bottom of my heart, thank you for being an important part of this journey. I pray Jesus' best blessings over you and your family.



A Kenya Story:

From Slums to Safety



The following is a letter penned from our Kenyan Country Director, who also serves as a house parent for one of our prevention homes in Kenya:

Dear Champions of Remember Nhu,

It gives me great joy and a deep sense of fulfilment when writing to you this note. Five years ago, my wife and I took in a group of 15 girls, and three years later added three more, to make a family of 18 precious children in a Remember Nhu home!

Five years and counting, these girls have become a beacon of hope...Just recently, we celebrated five years since the establishment of our prevention home. We all **THANKED GOD** for how far He has brought us as a family! The girls know very well that this home has been a haven for them. They have shared with me endless and painful stories that their peers and even family members in the slums have gone through these past five years.

The sad stories they have seen and heard has made them find even more gratitude and thanked Remember Nhu for having come to their help. Rape cases in the slums, teenage pregnancies, drug and substance abuse, abortions, early deaths, school dropouts—just to mention but a few of these vices have happened to their friends and relatives.

The good news is that Remember Nhu has stood with each of these girls and given them a new "lease of life" these past five years. These 18 girls are progressing well with their studies, learning more about the Word of God, growing physically and mentally each week. They are more aware of their self-worth; I have watched with my own eyes their self-esteem and confi-

dence grow and grow. I am personally grateful to God for entrusting us to be His Hands and Feet to nurture these children for His glory!

The Children are very grateful for their sponsors and pray for them every single day! It is something they do not take lightly.

So, in retrospect, we THANK GOD for His blessings through Remember Nhu and the many good people like you who support the children. The girls are so fortunate that they are no longer in the slums. They also know that once they graduate from this home, their lives will be positively changed for good! They will have been empowered to know what is good for them; they will not be swayed to run away from the truth and light they have received in the home over the years. I am convinced they will be our own agents of change in the slums and in the communities that they came from.

Just like the boy in the Bible who had five loaves of bread, the young boy shared the five loaves without hesitation and reservation. The miracle of multiplication took place and many people were fed. Thanks to Remember Nhu and the sponsors for saying yes to meet the needs of these precious children! Your five years of support to these children will surely be rewarded and exceedingly so! This is just one home of the many children that you have touched in Kenya!

I have attached a few notes from some of the children who want to express their heartfelt gratitude.

Champion Spotlight:

Young Boys Save Children Through Origami Fundraiser

One of the many joys in being part of a movement like Remember Nhu is watching people with generous hearts rise up to give in creative and sacrificial ways to help prevent children from exploitation around the globe.

This past year, we were blown away when a wonderful and inspiring story un-'folded' during the holiday season from some of Remember Nhu's youngest Champions! Two brothers, Elijah and Levi (age 8 and 5) love the hobby of paper-folding, and came up with the idea to sell their origami creations and donate all the proceeds to benefit Remember Nhu.

"We have always told our children that they are never too young to be used by God for His good purposes, and that everything they do can be used to honor the Lord," says Teresa, their loving mother. Teresa and her husband Jack are longtime Champions who have generously supported numerous Remember Nhu prevention homes. "The idea was all theirs," Teresa notes, "we only helped them develop a platform from which they could share the fundraiser."

The boys, Elijah and Levi, made five origami designs and invited donors in their community to select which origami pieces they wanted in exchange for a freewill donation of their choice. After receiving over 40 orders, the children worked hard to fold, package and mail the origami creations to each donor—to destinations from the family's local neighborhood, all the way to Switzerland!

In all, the generous 8-yr-old and 5-yr-old brothers folded over 80 pieces of origami, generating over \$1,600 in donations from family and friends—which was then doubled by a matching grant on Giving Tuesday. In the end, the creative youngsters' hard work raised a grand total of \$3,200 that was donated to help Remember Nhu children their age, and older.

"This was an idea that came out of their young hearts," adds their father, Jack. "Teresa and I simply helped them to focus on having an avenue for the biggest impact—and God did the rest."

On behalf of Remember Nhu, and the children served on the field, thank you to Elijah and Levi for your incredible example of selfless love and generosity to help others! We believe that one day, in heaven—many, many years from now—you will come to fully realize the amazing impact you had in helping others, even at an early age.



Volunteer & Staff Opportunities

Calling All Medical & Dental Professionals



Remember Nhu is continually aiming for excellence in caring for the holistic health of formerly at-risk children within our prevention homes. Over the years, this has involved many amazing medical professionals who travel to check and treat our children. We currently have needs for medical professionals to assist in telehealth consulting with our in-country partners, and opportunities in volunteer short-term medical travel on the field.

In addition, we have recently launched a Dental Health Care Initiative. Through this initiative, we will be sending volunteer dental professionals to provide dental services for our children and network with local dental providers. We are excited to expand the oral health care of the children! This is an integral part of our commitment to provide a caring, nurturing environment through our prevention homes.

We are in need of medical & dental professionals who are interested in being involved with our teams around the world. We are assembling a national list of individuals who are passionate about the mission of Remember Nhu, trained in the dental or medical professions, as well as currently licensed and aware of best practices. Cross-cultural experience is always appreciated, but not required. Would you consider joining our network of volunteer dental or medical professionals? Would you share this opportunity to serve with your network of professionals & influencers?

Volunteer & Staff Roles Needed

Applications are currently being accepted for the following roles. Experience with pediatric patients is a plus but not required for these roles. Each role description is a general overview of what is required, however, the role requirements are not limited to these descriptions.

DOCTORS (MD, DO, GP)

Role description: triage, conduct general wellness exams, treat when possible/refer when necessary. PAs & NPs are also a tremendous help and welcomed part of the team.

NURSES (RN, LPN)

Role description: assist doctors, maintain patient records, assist with training of local Health Coach

ASSISTANTS and HELPERS

Role description: prepare children & their paperwork before they see doctor, keep inventories, monitor supplies, general assistance where needed

DENTISTS

Role description: perform gum & teeth examinations, take and read x-rays, administer anesthesia, restore/fill decayed teeth, place amalgams, extract teeth as necessary

DENTAL ASSISTANTS

Role description: sterilize instruments, & equipment, prep patients, maintain patient records, anticipate & prep for what dentist needs, take x-rays

DENTAL HYGIENISTS

Role description: perform teeth cleanings, examine for signs of oral disease, train Health Coach in best practices for oral hygiene and health, apply fluoride varnish

DENTAL HELPERS

Role description: sanitize equipment, prepare children and their paperwork, keep inventories, monitor supplies, assist where needed
